3. JOC DE LA NICULITEL (Dobrogea) カセリックン第 Niculitel: a village Joc: play; play in the sense of dance as dance can also be play (joke)

4. BATUTA DE LA BOTOSANI (Moldova) 柿園山重游 Batuta: stamp dance or dance with stamps Botosani: a place in Moldova

5. HORA A DOUA DE LA GOICEA (Oltenia) 第二項提 * The second hora from Goicea

6. SARBA DE LA CALARASI (Basarabia) 卡拉蒂斯 供決速辩 Sarba: a great dance family in Romania with quick rhythm Calarasi: a village

7. PAPUSELELE (Dobrogea) ノールッドももた

* Little dolls - the dance of the little dolls Dancers wear masks on their heads and at the back of their heads. This connects with the customs which are done before people get married in order to check the feelings of the boys, whether they may recognize the girls or not, and to check whether they are serious or not. 8. PE PICIOR DIN TINCA (Transilvania) 拍腿對 Pe Picior: on the foot

9. BATUTA URSULUI (Bucovina) 能告粪

* Stamp dance of the bear / the bear dance At New Year, a lot of groups represent animals, goats, bears, horses, and they go to the houses to wish happy new year. It is a very great ceremony since people think that if the groups come, along their houses or yards, they will get good harvest and better life in the whole year.

10. BRAUL DE LA FANTANA VOINEI (Banat) 芬天拿和引皮带奔 Fantana Voinei: a village

Braul: the name of the dance from the position of the hands which are on the belts of the neighbours. Nobody, however, puts his hands on the belts in Banat today; he either puts them down or on his neighbours' shoulders.

11. TORA (Aroman) 現在到400.

Aromanians live in south of Danube, actually in Greece and Macedonia. Their language is very simil ar to Romanian language.

12. CADANEASCA DREAPTA (Dobrogea) 広向セ子義

* Dance of the girls It is no longer a girls' dance in Doborgea; it is a mixed dance done by everybody. As 'dreapta' means 'right', this dance is different from other cadaneasca. It goes always to the right, with very little movement to the left.

13. JOCURI DE NUNTA DIN CAMARZANA (Transilvania) かいしみ山倉が啓護病 Jocuri: dances De Nunta: of marriage Din Camarzana: from the village Camarzana in Oas * The wedding dances from Camarzana It is a ritual dance which is done on the last evening before a bride gets married. While she sits in the middle of the room, her girlfriends dance round her, singing out her future.

14. GARLICEANCA DE LA DAENI (Dobrogea) 菲立つく派 Garla: water, river, pond Garliceanca: stay near the water

15. STANGA DE LA GROPENI (Muntenia) 左向圓嵗 Stanga: left Gropeni: a village * Hora which goes to the left from Gropeni

16. TREI PAZESTE DE LA MACESU (Oltenia) カェ (走,)、い Trei Pazeste: three times 'take care' or three times 'mind' Since the dance is difficult, you must mind three times before you start doing it.

17. HORA DE LA CHIRCANI (Basarabia) 方前道起 Hora: A big family of dance like Sarba; it is always a cirle dance Chircani: a village

18. ARICIUL (Muntenia) * 4 Ariciul: a small and nice animal called hedgehog

19. MANDRELE (Olentia) ック型とらソナ Mandrele: pretty, proud and nice girls

20. FECIORESC DIN CEHUL SILVANIEI (Transilvania) 捷可其作雲尼重男豬 Fecio: young man (lad) Cehul Silvaniei: a village * Man dance from Cehul Silvaniei

21. BRAUL DE LA BRAIESTI (Muntenia) 比维士皮学类 Braiesti: a village * Belt from Braiesti 22. CORAGHEASCA IN TREI (Moldova) 舟乃夫三小節 Coragheasca: boatmen In Trei: in three bars * A boatmen's dance in three bars

23. BRAUL BORLOVENILOR (Banat) 寶羅雲利拿皮帶裝 In Banat, most of the men dances are braul Borlovenilor: a village

24. RUSTEMUL CAZUT (Oltenia) 宇宇 h之)

Rustemul: a family of dances very popular in Oltenia; typical rhythm is 5/8 and 6/8 Cazut: fallen down The knees must be bent in this dance, and at some

moments, dancers may fall down on the ground.
